ELECTRONIC PRESCRIPTIONS



We are very excited to be part of a small number of practices that are being trained to use an electronic prescribing system which will start in the summer. This system will not affect anything you currently do, but we do need your help initially.

Your chosen pharmacist will have to obtain your signature to enable us to send your prescription to them electronically.

By allowing us to send your prescription to them electronically you will help us to be able to track your prescription along its journey and save the doctor time when signing the prescriptions.

BOWEL CANCER SCREENING



Our patients results for screening:

861 of our patients have been invited, 507 of you completed the test = 58.89% screened. The average uptake in our area is 59.32% so we are slightly below average. I am therefore providing a reminder for you all about the screening:

This programme invites all men and women between the ages of 60 and 69, who are registered with a GP, to undertake a Faecal Occult Blood Test (FOBt) in the form of a home testing kit, every two years. The kit is then returned for analysis and should a positive result be found, the individual is invited to investigate the reason for this positive result.

You should receive a kit within 6 weeks of your 60th birthday.
