If you are away from home and you forget your medication you need to go to a local NHS doctor's surgery and ask for help. We are very used to dealing with matters like this for patients visiting Eastbourne and all surgeries have a joint agreement with each other to look after patients who are away from home on holiday.

It would however be very sensible to take your repeat prescription form away with you as well as your medication and then if you do forget your tablets, it makes it easier for the temporary doctor to help you.
